2024 Residents' Experience Survey - Commencement

The Australian Government's 2024 Residents' Experience Survey will commence in February and conclude in October.

The annual survey is an opportunity for residents to share their experiences and views about the care they receive to inform your ongoing quality improvement activities. The survey contributes to the Star Rating on the My Aged Care website.

The Australian Government has engaged Health Consult to lead the independent group that will conduct the Residents' Experience Survey in 2024 and 2025. Health Consult has partnered with Access Care Network Australia (ACNA) to deliver the survey. A team from ACNA will conduct the survey in person at your residential aged care home. We will keep you all updated on the dates.


AFL Footy Tipping Participation information for March 2024:

It's donut making time!




The residents had a great time participating, cooking and of course, tasting the all lovely home made donuts.

Thank you to RN Janet for bringing in her donut machine. We can't wait for the next batch!

















Residents were asked 'What's your secret to lasting love?'. Many different answers were thought of carefully.




A Walk Down Memory Lane

THEN & NOW

THE STORY OF: WOODWARD PARK - HALLIDAY STREET, PORT PIRIE
Returning to Australia in May 1919, Oliver Holmes Woodward, Military Medal
with Two Bars went to the Mount Morgan Gold Mining Co. before taking up an
appointment at Port Pirie, as a General Metallurgist.

May 1933, Woodward established behind his home on The Terrace, a small herd of 3 cows and a young bull on six acres of land registering it as "Marana Jersey Stud". The six acres of land would later become Woodward Park.

Woodward expressed the land, which was owned by the BHAS, should be converted into an attractive park for Port Pirie residents. In July 1935, construction began in his honour - Therefore, 'Woodward Park' was born.





Continuous Quality Improvement




Continuous improvement is a core part of the governance framework at St Joseph's House.


All continuous improvements that are implemented are for the purpose of improving the care and services that everyone at St Jospeh's House receives.

The latest Government advice. Aged Care homes must have our own risk management strategies – ours include:

- we will only implement masks if there is a high community risk or a positive case of covid (RSM to decide this)
- To maintain the 1.5m as required we advise 2 visitors in the room at a time
- We ask for visitors to limit movement around the facility where possible RAT screen every second day

GOVERNMENT ADVICE

Advice for visitors

To enter a residential aged care home

Residential aged care homes may have strict procedures for visitors to follow, in line with the directions of their state or territory government.

When you visit a residential aged care home you may need to:

- be screened before entering, including taking a RAT test
- wash your hands before entering and when leaving a resident's room
- stay 1.5 meters away from residents, where possible
- wear a mask
- Stay home when unwell

Do not visit a residential aged care home if you:

- have tested positive to COVID-19 in the past 7 days
- have been in contact with someone confirmed to have COVID-19 in the past 7 days are unwell, including with a fever or symptoms of acute respiratory illness (such as a cough, sore throat, runny nose, shortness of breath).

Visitor requirements while at a residential aged care home:

Visitors must:

- supervise any accompanying children
- practice good hand hygiene
- comply with directions given by staff
- follow any other requirements put in place by the residential aged care home.

Feedback and Complaints Process

St Joseph's House supports the rights of Consumers and their representatives to provide compliments, feedback, concerns or to make a complaint.

Once received, the Quality Coordinator will make a record of lodgement and the feedback or complaint is assessed for response and follow up by a senior staff member.
