Power boards that are brought in for care recipient rooms must first be given to staff so they can be tagged and tested. All power board's must also have individual on/off switches for each outlet.









Community Care Corner....



Welcome to Winter! There has been a lot of media about the increased cases of the flu this year. Bearing this in mind it is advisable that you have a flu shot. The community care staff have all been offered and administered their annual flu shot last week. If you haven't had your flu shot yet this year please advise your careworker who can assist with making an appointment with your local GP and transport if necessary.

In the latest Consumer Advisory Group meeting it was agreed that everyone would like a social outing for Christmas in July. We have settled on a date Thursday 25th July at 12.15. We are going to the Prince Edward Hotel, Wallaroo for a 2 course meal for around \$17.00. Partners, friends and family all welcome. Your invitation will arrive soon, so keep the date free.

Once again I would like to thank everyone for their patience with the transfer of the Consumer budget statements and invoicing to a new database. We have been challenged with learning the new skill in finance! The first lot of invoices and statements has been sent for March and April and I have enclosed a letter with any issues I have identified. Please look closely at the statements and contact either Wendy or myself if you have any queries. Again, we offer our apologies for the delay in receiving statements/invoices in past months and are taking steps to ensure the May statements and invoices will be received in a timely manner.

Wendy has been instrumental in learning and implementing the new database with Fiona now working 2 days extra in the office to assist with Wendys extra workload. Natasha will have a focus on preparing for the Pakerville Field days, Smelters picnic and other community engagements. Rebecca (Bec) Watson will be helping out and with her 30 years experience in Aged Care will be a valuable asset.

There are some changes in Aged Care which are effective from July 1st 2019. This includes the New Aged Care Standards which will encompass Home care, residential care, transitional care and the Commonwealth Home Support Program. The staff all attended an education session on Tuesday 27th with very much the emphasis on you being in control of your package, setting your own goals and designing your own care plan. Bec Watson will be coming out to assist with the annual reviews with a focus on you directing your own care needs. On July 1st there is also a legislative requirement that all service providers will have a universal schedule of fees. This will be displayed on the My Aged Care website. We will send everyone a copy of the fee schedule with a new agreement indicating your acceptance of the new pricing. The agreements will be renewed at your annual review.

Well as you all know I had a holiday overseas. I enjoyed spending time with my second son who is teaching in London. We travelled to Lake Como a very picturesque place in Northern Italy on the Swiss border and then onto Rome. It was Easter so the Vatican City was very busy! We then travelled to Ireland and hired a car to travel around Southern Ireland. We found the Irish extremely friendly with seemingly not a care in the world. A trip to be remembered!

A Message from the Lifestyle / Hospitality Team....

June 15th is Elder Abuse Awareness Day.

Elder abuse is mistreatment of an older person that is committed by someone with whom the older person has a relationship of trust such as a partner, family member, friend or carer. Elder abuse may be physical, social, financial, psychological or sexual and can include mistreatment and neglect. Elder maltreatment can lead to serious physical injuries and long-term psychological consequences.

Older people have the right, just like people of all ages, to live safely free from harm, abuse, and exploitation. Any actions that breach this right are a form of abuse.

ARAS will be here on Wednesday, 26th June to discuss the rights of older people and provide residents and families with more information.

Compliments and Complaints Process



St Joseph's House supports the rights of Care Recipients and their Advocates to share compliments, feedback, concerns or to make a complaint.
