Feedback and Complaints Process

St Joseph's House supports the rights of Consumers and their representatives to provide compliments, feedback, concerns or to make a complaint.

If you wish to provide feedback or make a complaint please feel free to approach a senior staff member:

If you wish to provide written feedback please feel free to:

- Email us admin@stjosephshouse.net.au
- Complete a Feedback Form available from various locations around the facility and place it in one of the feedback boxes.

Once received, the Quality Coordinator will make a record of lodgement and the feedback or complaint is assessed for response and follow up by a senior staff member.

Visitors cannot enter an aged care facility if:

They have been a close contact of a positive COVID-19 case within the last 7 days.

They have symptoms of acute respiratory infection.

They have undertaken a COVID-19 (PCR) test and are awaiting the test result unless part of routine surveillance testing and do not have symptoms.

If a visitor tests positive on a rat test prior to visiting.

It is mandated that visitors wear a face mask at all times when in the physical presence of others, except if eating or drinking (for all visitors over the age of 12).

It is compulsory that visitors undertake a RAT screening test prior to entry.

Visitors should stay 1.5m from others wherever possible.


What does this mean?






Continuous Quality Improvements

Last year the Department of Health and Aged Care announced that they are reviewing the Aged Care Quality Standards. The Quality Standards set the expectation for the care and services all aged care providers deliver. The consultation period for these standards has finished and the Department has announced that we can expect a new set of Quality Standards to come into effect this year.

When these new Quality Standards commence more information will be provided in greater detail. For now, here is an overview of the outcomes that St Joseph's House will need to met under the new Quality Standards:

- We reorder once a resident is down to the last 10 labels.
- 50 labels are reordered at a time (new residents order 100 labels initially)
- The recharge to residents is the cost price only.
- SJH absorbs the GST and the postage costs.

The cost to residents is 50 labels @ \$20, this goes onto their next invoice once received from supplier



Answers to, Can you Identify these items

1) This brass box has a handle on the top and an adjustable vent on the front.

If you guessed that it's a **foot warmer** then you are correct. The small size and handle suggest portability and this would have been used to warm the feet of riders in a carriage. Even early cars needed to have some kind of heat source since heaters weren't common in automobiles until the 1930s. It wasn't until 1933 that the <u>first indash heater</u> was built by the Ford Motor Company.

2) Next up we have a very beat up, aqua blue metal container with a spout on one side.

Your mom may or may not have used one of these. It's a **powdered detergent dispenser** from before all our boxes had spouts built in. This perhaps explains why it's so danged beat up!

3) Ceramic and conical, this piece has a screw base similar to a light bulb and has many small metal coils around its outside.

If you guessed **heating "bulb"** you've got it! A cool (or should we say "hot") vintage item, this heating element uses the metal coils to distribute heat once it's screwed in.

4) These are stepped-down in size along the length of each object. They have metal caps on the ends as well, with a slot at the top of the larger end.

If you thought they were **industrial textile spools** then you are ahead of the pack! Used to hold the thread that textiles were made from, I've heard it said that the shape means that they can be changed out easily for other colors.


