
In Spain, it is believed that if you eat one grape in time with each chime of the clock at midnight, then you will be rewarded with luck and happiness in the coming year.


In January we have a lovely couple who are so kindly travelling from Port Pirie to entertain us- Darryl and Sue on the 11th January.

Please remember to contact one of the activities staff if you have any needs, suggestions, or concerns, especially regarding video calls.
















A male budgie by the name of STAR has been donated to Star of the Sea. The Residents love playing with him as he has been hand raised.

We worked hard and saved up so that Ben and I could take an overseas holiday.

It was a holiday of a lifetime where we went away for 3 months and based ourselves in London.

We had a wonderful time as we got to know my father's sisters, my cousins and extended family.

During this time, we also travelled to Italy, France, Switzerland, Austria, Scotland and Wales.

We had a wonderful time but the last three weeks I was missing my girls and ready for home.

In my spare time I was very involved with the Wallaroo Social Club - we held Bingo weekly and then donated the money that we raised to children's charities.

I was very proud of this organisation and all of the work that I put into it.

I now have 7 grandchildren and 15 great grandchildren.

My family is my world and I love them all dearly.

What are you most proud of?


What Ben and I achieved in our marriage of 67 years.


I am very proud of all the things we have done and seen.

If you had to give one piece of advice what would it be?


Work hard for what you want to achieve in life and be happy. Do things to suit yourself.


