World Elder Abuse Awareness Day

15th June 2024

World Elder Abuse Awareness Day (WEAAD) is celebrated each year on June 15th, globally, providing an opportunity for communities to stand together against the abuse, mistreatment and neglect of older people.

What is elder abuse?

Elder abuse comes in many forms. It can be financial, emotional, psychological, physical, sexual, or social. Elder abuse can occur once, or many times and can vary in severity from subtle through to extreme. It can include one or a combination of the different types of abuse.

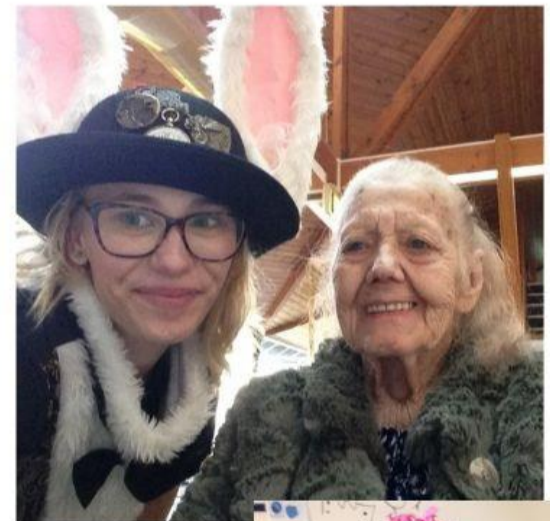
Most often, elder abuse is carried out by someone known to the older person, with two thirds of abusers being an adult child. Abusers can also be other family members, relatives, or friends.

Elder abuse affects people of all genders and all walks of life. The abuse, however, disproportionately affects women – two-thirds of people seeking help from SRV are women.

Culturally and Linguistically Diverse communities, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities and LGBTQI+ communities are additionally vulnerable, as are older people living in rural and regional communities.

THE FEDERAL HOTEL

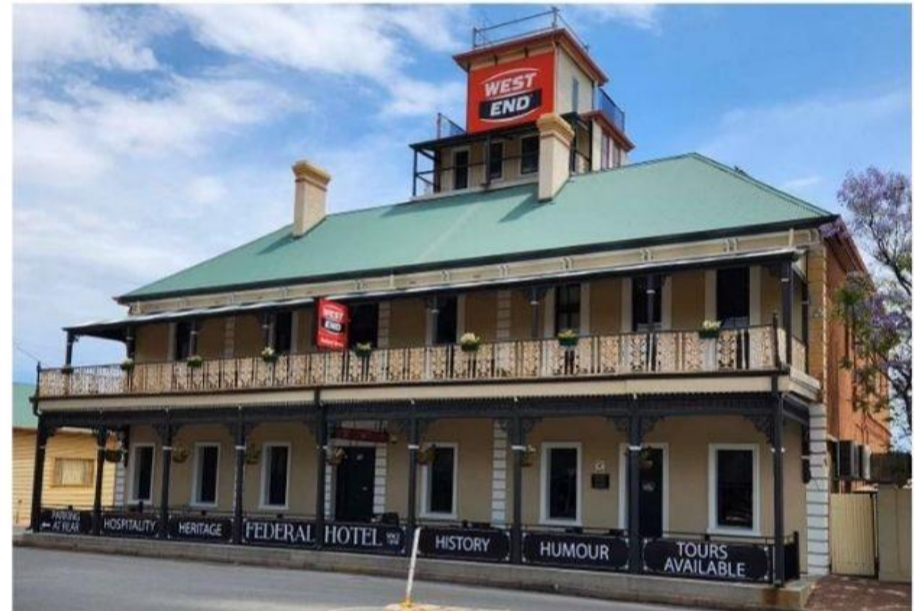
The Federal Hotel opened in 1898 as the Rising Sun Hotel and was changed to the Federal Hotel in 1900, prior to federation on 1 January 1901.

It is said the tower was used by Wharfies to spot arriving cargo ships.

As you can see, the photo taken from the roof top observatory shows the flood waters from 1934. Port Pirie has many low lying areas within the township where flooding is not uncommon.

The latest Government advice. Aged Care homes must have our own risk management strategies – ours include:

- we will only implement masks if there is a high community risk or a positive case of covid (RSM to decide this)
- To maintain the 1.5m as required we advise 2 visitors in the room at a time
- We ask for visitors to limit movement around the facility where possible
RAT screen every second day

GOVERNMENT ADVICE

Advice for visitors

To enter a residential aged care home

Residential aged care homes may have strict procedures for visitors to follow, in line with the directions of their state or territory government.

When you visit a residential aged care home you may need to:

- be screened before entering, including taking a RAT test
- wash your hands before entering and when leaving a resident's room
- stay 1.5 meters away from residents, where possible
- wear a mask
- Stay home when unwell

Do not visit a residential aged care home if you:

- have tested positive to COVID-19 in the past 7 days
- have been in contact with someone confirmed to have COVID-19 in the past 7 days
are unwell, including with a fever or symptoms of acute respiratory illness (such as a cough, sore throat, runny nose, shortness of breath).

Visitor requirements while at a residential aged care home:

Visitors must:

- supervise any accompanying children
- practice good hand hygiene
- comply with directions given by staff
- follow any other requirements put in place by the residential aged care home.
